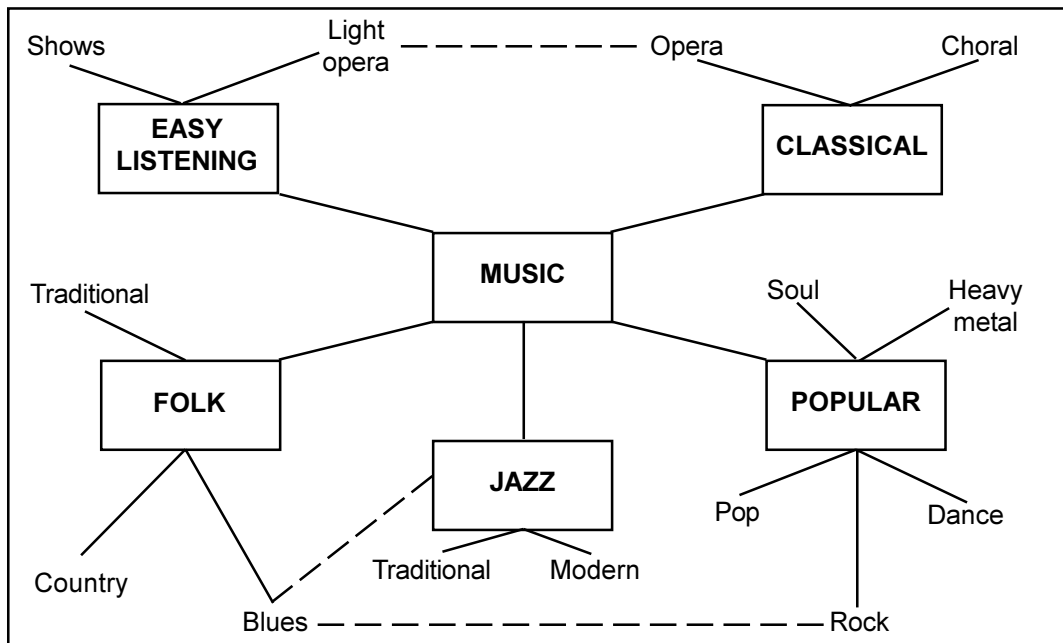
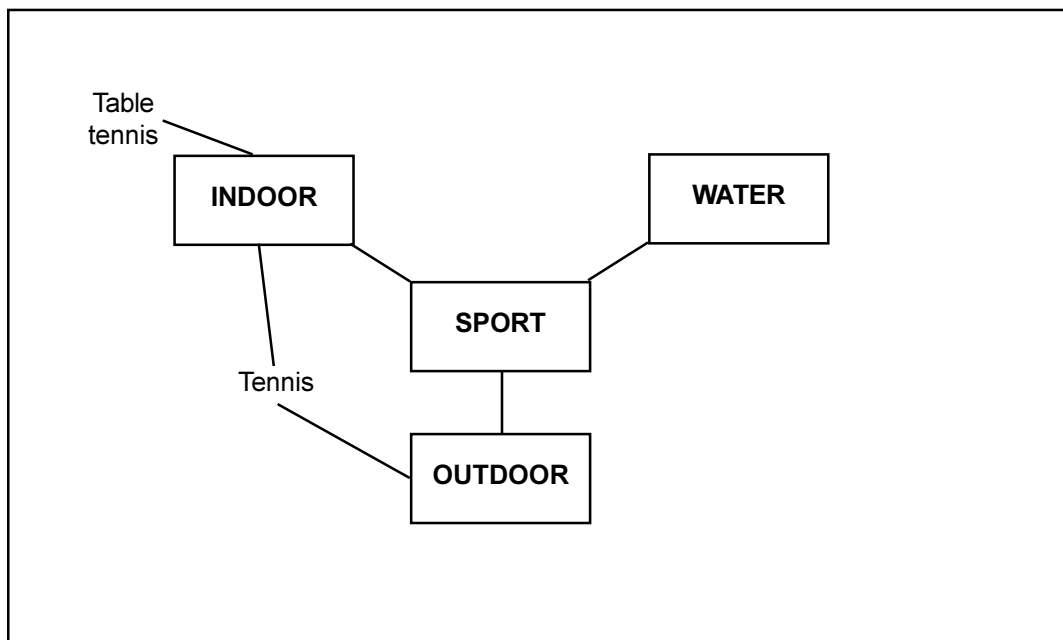


MIND-MAPPING
